Psalm 1 Beatus vir qui non abiit

- ¹ Happy are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, * nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!
- ² Their delight is in the law of the LORD, * and they meditate on his law day and night.
- ³ They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; * everything they do shall prosper.

Psalm 2 Quare fremuerunt gentes?

- ⁷ Let me announce the decree of the Lord: * he said to me, "You are my Son; this day have I begotten you.
- ⁸ Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for your inheritance * and the ends of the earth for your possession."
- ¹³ Happy are they all * who take refuge in him!

Psalm 3 Domine, quid multiplicati

- ³ You, O Lord, are a shield about me; * you are my glory, the one who lifts up my head.
- ⁴ I call aloud upon the Lord, * and he answers me from his holy hill;
- ⁵ I lie down and go to sleep; *
 I wake again, because the Lord sustains me.
- 8 Deliverance belongs to the Lord. * Your blessing be upon your people!

Psalm 4 Cum invocarem

- ¹ Answer me when I call, O God, defender of my cause; * you set me free when I am hard-pressed; have mercy on me and hear my prayer.
- ³ Know that the Lord does wonders for the faithful; * when I call upon the Lord, he will hear me.
- ⁴ Tremble, then, and do not sin; * speak to your heart in silence upon your bed.
- ⁵ Offer the appointed sacrifices * and put your trust in the Lord.
- ⁶ Many are saying, "Oh, that we might see better times!" * Lift up the light of your countenance upon us, O Lord.
- ⁷ You have put gladness in my heart, * more than when grain and wine and oil increase.
- ⁸ I lie down in peace; at once I fall asleep; * for only you, Lord, make me dwell in safety.

Psalm 5 Verba mea auribus

- ¹ Give ear to my words, O Lord; * consider my meditation.
- ² Hearken to my cry for help, my King and my God, * for I make my prayer to you.
- ³ In the morning, Lord, you hear my voice; * early in the morning I make my appeal and watch for you.
- ⁷ Through the greatness of your mercy I will go into your house; * I will bow down toward your holy temple in awe of you.
- ⁸ Lead me, O Lord, in your righteousness, ¹³ for all who take refuge in you will be glad; * they will sing out their joy for ever.
- ¹⁴ You will shelter them, * so that those who love your Name may exult in you.
- ¹⁵ For you, O Lord, will bless the righteous; * you will defend them with your favor as with a shield.

Psalm 6 Domine, ne in furore

- ² Have pity on me, Lord, for I am weak; * heal me, Lord, for my bones are racked.
- ³ My spirit shakes with terror; * how long, O Lord, how long?
- ⁴ Turn, O Lord, and deliver me; * save me for your mercy's sake.
- ⁶ I grow weary because of my groaning; * every night I drench my bed and flood my couch with tears.
- ⁹ The Lord has heard my supplication; * the Lord accepts my prayer.

Psalm 7 Domine, Deus meus

- ⁷ Awake, O my God, decree justice; * let the assembly of the peoples gather round you.
- ⁸ Be seated on your lofty throne, O Most High; *O Lord, judge the nations.
- ¹⁰ Let the malice of the wicked come to an end, but establish the righteous; * for you test the mind and heart, O righteous God.
- ¹¹ God is my shield and defense; * he is the savior of the true in heart.
- ¹² God is a righteous judge; * God sits in judgment every day.
- ¹⁵ Look at those who are in labor with wickedness, * who conceive evil, and give birth to a lie.
- ¹⁸ I will bear witness that the Lord is righteous; * I will praise the Name of the Lord Most High.

¹ O Lord our Governor, * how exalted is your Name in all the world!

- ² Out of the mouths of infants and children * your majesty is praised above the heavens.
- ³ You have set up a stronghold against your adversaries, * to quell the enemy and the avenger.
- ⁴ When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, * the moon and the stars you have set in their courses,
- ⁵ What is man that you should be mindful of him? * the son of man that you should seek him out?
- ⁶ You have made him but little lower than the angels; * you adorn him with glory and honor;
- ⁷ You give him mastery over the works of your hands; * you put all things under his feet:
- 8 All sheep and oxen, * even the wild beasts of the field,
- ⁹ The birds of the air, the fish of the sea, * and whatsoever walks in the paths of the sea.
- ¹⁰ O Lord our Governor, * how exalted is your Name in all the world!

Psalm 9 Confitebor tibi

- ¹ I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; * I will tell of all your marvelous works.
- ² I will be glad and rejoice in you; * I will sing to your Name, O Most High.
- 8 It is he who rules the world with righteousness; * he judges the peoples with equity.
- ⁹ The Lord will be a refuge for the oppressed, * a refuge in time of trouble.
- ¹⁰ Those who know your Name will put their trust in you, * for you never forsake those who seek you, O Lord.
- ¹¹ Sing praise to the Lord who dwells in Zion; * proclaim to the peoples the things he has done.
- ¹⁸ For the needy shall not always be forgotten, * and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever.

Psalm 10 Ut quid, Domine?

- ¹² Rise up, O Lord; lift up your hand, O God; * do not forget the afflicted.
- ¹⁴ Surely, you behold trouble and misery; * you see it and take it into your own hand.
- ¹⁵ The helpless commit themselves to you, * for you are the helper of orphans.
- ¹⁸ The Lord will hear the desire of the humble; * you will strengthen their heart and your ears shall hear;
- ¹⁹ To give justice to the orphan and oppressed, * so that mere mortals may strike terror no more.

Psalm 11 In Domino confide

- ³ When the foundations are being destroyed, * what can the righteous do?"
- ⁴ The Lord is in his holy temple; * the Lord's throne is in heaven.
- ⁵ His eyes behold the inhabited world; * his piercing eye weighs our worth.
- ⁶ The Lord weighs the righteous as well as the wicked, * but those who delight in violence he abhors.
- ⁸ For the Lord is righteous; he delights in righteous deeds; * and the just shall see his face.

Psalm 12 Salvum me fac

- ⁵ "Because the needy are oppressed, and the poor cry out in misery, * I will rise up," says the Lord, "and give them the help they long for."
- ⁶ The words of the Lord are pure words, * like silver refined from ore and purified seven times in the fire.
- ⁷ O Lord, watch over us * and save us from this generation for ever.

Psalm 13 Usquequo, Domine?

- ⁵ I put my trust in your mercy; * my heart is joyful because of your saving help.
- ⁶ I will sing to the Lord, for he has dealt with me richly; * I will praise the Name of the Lord Most High.

Psalm 14 Dixit insipiens

- ¹ The fool has said in his heart, "There is no God." * All are corrupt and commit abominable acts; there is none who does any good.
- ² The Lord looks down from heaven upon us all, * to see if there is any who is wise, if there is one who seeks after God.
- ³ Every one has proved faithless; all alike have turned bad; * there is none who does good; no, not one.
- ⁴ Have they no knowledge, all those evildoers * who eat up my people like bread and do not call upon the Lord?
- ⁵ See how they tremble with fear, * because God is in the company of the righteous.
- ⁶ Their aim is to confound the plans of the afflicted, * but the Lord is their refuge.
- ⁷ Oh, that Israel's deliverance would come out of Zion! * when the Lord restores the fortunes of his people, Jacob will rejoice and Israel be glad.

Psalm 15 Domine, quis habitabit?

- ¹ Lord, who may dwell in your tabernacle? * who may abide upon your holy hill?
- ² Whoever leads a blameless life and does what is right, * who speaks the truth from his heart.

- ³ There is no guile upon his tongue; he does no evil to his friend; * he does not heap contempt upon his neighbor.
- ⁴ In his sight the wicked is rejected, * but he honors those who revere the Lord.
- ⁵ He has sworn to do no wrong * and does not take back his word.
- ⁶ He does not give his money in hope of gain, * nor does he take a bribe against the innocent.
- ⁷ Whoever does these things * shall never be overthrown.

Psalm 16 Conserva me. Domine

- ¹ Protect me, O God, for I take refuge in you; * I have said to the Lord, "You are my Lord, my good above all other."
- ⁵ O Lord, you are my portion and my cup; * it is you who uphold my lot.
- ⁶ My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; * indeed, I have a goodly heritage.
- ⁷ I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel; * my heart teaches me, night after night.
- ⁸ I have set the Lord always before me; * because he is at my right hand I shall not fall.
- ⁹ My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit rejoices; * my body also shall rest in hope.
- ¹⁰ For you will not abandon me to the grave, * nor let your holy one see the Pit.
- ¹¹ You will show me the path of life; * in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

Psalm 17 Exaudi, Domine

- ⁶ I call upon you, O God, for you will answer me; * incline your ear to me and hear my words.
- ⁷ Show me your marvelous loving-kindness, * O Savior of those who take refuge at your right hand.
- ⁸ Keep me as the apple of your eye; * hide me under the shadow of your wings,
- ¹⁶ And at my vindication I shall see your face; * when I awake, I shall be satisfied, beholding your likeness.

Psalm 18

Part 1 *Diligam te, Domine.*

- ¹ I love you, O Lord my strength, *
- O Lord my stronghold, my crag, and my haven.
- ² My God, my rock in whom I put my trust, * my shield, the horn of my salvation, and my refuge; you are worthy of praise.
- ¹⁷ He reached down from on high and grasped me; * he drew me out of great waters.

²⁰ He brought me out into an open place; * he rescued me because he delighted in me.

Psalm 18

Part II Et retribuet mihi

²⁶ With the faithful you show yourself faithful, O God; * with the forthright you show yourself forthright.

²⁹ You, O Lord, are my lamp; * my God, you make my darkness bright.

³⁰ With you I will break down an enclosure; * with the help of my God I will scale any wall.

³¹ As for God, his ways are perfect; the words of the Lord are tried in the fire; * he is a shield to all who trust in him.

³² For who is God, but the Lord? * who is the Rock, except our God?

³³ It is God who girds me about with strength * and makes my way secure.

³⁴ He makes me sure-footed like a deer * and lets me stand firm on the heights.

³⁶ * Your right hand also sustains me; your loving care makes me great.

³⁷ You lengthen my stride beneath me, * and my ankles do not give way.

⁶ It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; * nothing is hidden from its burning heat.

- ⁷ Some put their trust in chariots and some in horses, * but we will call upon the Name of the Lord our God.

Psalm 21 Domine, in virtute tua

- ¹ The king rejoices in your strength, O Lord; * how greatly he exults in your victory!
- ² You have given him his heart's desire; * you have not denied him the request of his lips.
- ³ For you meet him with blessings of prosperity, * and set a crown of fine gold upon his head.
- ⁴ He asked you for life, and you gave it to him: * length of days, for ever and ever.
- ⁵ His honor is great, because of your victory; * splendor and majesty have you bestowed upon him.
- ⁶ For you will give him everlasting felicity * and will make him glad with the joy of your presence.
- ⁷ For the king puts his trust in the Lord; * because of the loving-kindness of the Most High, he will not fall.

Psalm 22 Deus, Deus meus

Part 1

- ¹ My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? * and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?
- ² O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; * by night as well, but I find no rest.

- ³ Yet you are the Holy One, * enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- ⁴ Our forefathers put their trust in you; * they trusted, and you delivered them.
- ⁵ They cried out to you and were delivered; * they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But as for me, I am a worm and no man, * scorned by all and despised by the people.
- ⁷ All who see me laugh me to scorn; * they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- ⁸ "He trusted in the Lord; let him deliver him; * let him rescue him, if he delights in him."
- ⁹ Yet you are he who took me out of the womb, * and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- ¹⁰ I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; * you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
- ¹¹ Be not far from me, for trouble is near, * and there is none to help.
- ¹² Many young bulls encircle me; * strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- ¹³ They open wide their jaws at me, * like a ravening and a roaring lion.
- ¹⁴ I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; * my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- ¹⁵ My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; * and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.
- ¹⁶ Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle around me; * they pierce my hands and my feet; I can count all my bones.
- ¹⁷ They stare and gloat over me; * they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing.
- ¹⁸ Be not far away, O Lord; * you are my strength; hasten to help me.
- ¹⁹ Save me from the sword, * my life from the power of the dog.
- ²⁰ Save me from the lion's mouth, * my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.
- ²¹ I will declare your Name to my brethren; * in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.

Psalm 22 Deus, Deus meus

Part 2

- ²² Praise the Lord, you that revere him; * stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel; all you of Jacob's line, give glory.
- ²³ For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither does he hide his face from them; * but when they cry to him he hears them.

- ²⁴ My praise is of him in the great assembly; *
 I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship him.

- ⁵ You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me; * you have anointed my head with oil, and my cup is running over.
- ⁶ Surely your goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, * and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

- ¹⁶ Show your servants your works * and your splendor to their children.
- ¹⁷ May the graciousness of the Lord our God be upon us; * prosper the work of our hands; prosper our handiwork.

Psalm 91 Qui habitat

- ¹ He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High, * abides under the shadow of the Almighty.
- ² He shall say to the Lord, "You are my refuge and my stronghold, * my God in whom I put my trust."
- ⁴ He shall cover you with his pinions, and you shall find refuge under his wings; * his faithfulness shall be a shield and buckler.
- ¹¹ For he shall give his angels charge over you, * to keep you in all your ways.
- ¹² They shall bear you in their hands, * lest you dash your foot against a stone.
- 14 Because he is bound to me in love, therefore will I deliver him; * I will protect him, because he knows my Name.
- ¹⁵ He shall call upon me, and I will answer him; *I am with him in trouble; I will rescue him and bring him to honor.
- ¹⁶ With long life will I satisfy him, * and show him my salvation.

- ⁵ Lord, how great are your works! * your thoughts are very deep.
- ¹² Those who are planted in the house of the Lord * shall flourish in the courts of our God;
- ¹³ They shall still bear fruit in old age; * they shall be green and succulent;
- ¹⁴ That they may show how upright the Lord is, * my Rock, in whom there is no fault.

Psalm 93 Dominus regnavit

- ¹ The Lord is King; he has put on splendid apparel; * the Lord has put on his apparel and girded himself with strength.
- ² He has made the whole world so sure * that it cannot be moved;
- ³ Ever since the world began, your throne has been established; * you are from everlasting.
- ⁴ The waters have lifted up, O Lord, the waters have lifted up their voice; * the waters have lifted up their pounding waves.
- ⁵ Mightier than the sound of many waters, mightier than the breakers of the sea, * mightier is the Lord who dwells on high.
- ⁶ Your testimonies are very sure, * and holiness adorns your house, O Lord, for ever and for evermore.

- ¹¹ The Lord knows our human thoughts; * how like a puff of wind they are.
- ¹² Happy are they whom you instruct, O Lord! *
- ¹³ to give them rest in evil days, *
- ¹⁴ For the Lord will not abandon his people, * nor will he forsake his own.
- ¹⁵ For judgment will again be just, * and all the true of heart will follow it.
- ¹⁷ If the Lord had not come to my help, * I should soon have dwelt in the land of silence.
- 18 As often as I said, "My foot has slipped," * your love, O Lord, upheld me.
- ¹⁹ When many cares fill my mind, * your consolations cheer my soul.
- ²² But the Lord has become my stronghold, * and my God the rock of my trust.

- ³ Declare his glory among the nations * and his wonders among all peoples.
- ⁴ For great is the Lord and greatly to be praised; * he is more to be admired than all gods.
- ⁵ As for all the gods of the nations, they are but idols; * but it is the Lord who made the heavens.
- ⁶ Oh, the majesty and magnificence of his presence! * Oh, the power and the splendor of his sanctuary!
- ⁷ Ascribe to the Lord, you families of the peoples; * ascribe to the Lord honor and power.
- ⁸ Ascribe to the Lord the honor due his Name; * bring offerings and come into his courts.
- ⁹ Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; * let the whole earth tremble before him.
- ¹⁰ Tell it out among the nations: "The Lord is King! * he has made the world so firm that it cannot be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity."
- ¹¹ Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea thunder and all that is in it; * let the field be joyful and all that is therein.
- ¹² Then shall all the trees of the wood shout for joy before the Lord when he comes, * when he comes to judge the earth.
- ¹³ He will judge the world with righteousness * and the peoples with his truth.

¹ The Lord is King; let the earth rejoice; * let the multitude of the isles be glad.

- ⁶ The heavens declare his righteousness, * and all the peoples see his glory.

- ⁷ With trumpets and the sound of the horn * shout with joy before the King, the Lord.
- ⁸ Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it, * the lands and those who dwell therein.
- ⁹ Let the rivers clap their hands, * and let the hills ring out with joy before the Lord, when he comes to judge the earth.
- ¹⁰ In righteousness shall he judge the world * and the peoples with equity.

- ⁹ Proclaim the greatness of the Lord our God and worship him upon his holy hill; * for the Lord our God is the Holy One.

- ¹ Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands; * serve the Lord with gladness and come before his presence with a song.
- ² Know this: The Lord himself is God; * he himself has made us, and we are his; we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.

- ³ Enter his gates with thanksgiving; go into his courts with praise; * give thanks to him and call upon his Name.
- ⁴ For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting; * and his faithfulness endures from age to age.

- ²² Bless the Lord, all you works of his, in all places of his dominion; * bless the Lord, O my soul.

(7 Let his days be few, * and let another take his office.)

- ¹ Hallelujah! I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart, * in the assembly of the upright, in the congregation.
- ² Great are the deeds of the Lord! * they are studied by all who delight in them.
- ³ His work is full of majesty and splendor, * and his righteousness endures for ever.
- ⁴ He makes his marvelous works to be remembered; * the Lord is gracious and full of compassion.
- ⁷ The works of his hands are faithfulness and justice; * all his commandments are sure.
- ⁸ They stand fast for ever and ever, * because they are done in truth and equity.
- ⁹ He sent redemption to his people; he commanded his covenant for ever; * holy and awesome is his Name.
- ¹⁰ The admiration of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; * those who act accordingly have a good understanding; his praise endures for ever.

Psalm 112 Beatus vir

- ¹ Hallelujah! Happy are they who admire the Lord * and have great delight in his commandments!
- ⁴ Light shines in the darkness for the upright; * the righteous are merciful and full of compassion.
- ⁵ It is good for them to be generous in lending * and to manage their affairs with justice.
- ⁶ For they will never be shaken; * the righteous will be kept in everlasting remembrance.
- ⁷ They will not be afraid of any evil rumors; * their heart is right; they put their trust in the Lord.

- ⁸ Their heart is established and will not shrink, *
- ⁹ They have given freely to the poor, * and their righteousness stands fast for ever; they will hold up their head with honor.

Psalm 113 Laudate, pueri

- ¹ Hallelujah! Give praise, you servants of the Lord; * praise the Name of the Lord.

- ⁴ The mountains skipped like rams, * and the little hills like young sheep.
- 5 What ailed you, O sea, that you fled? * O Jordan, that you turned back?
- ⁶ You mountains, that you skipped like rams? * you little hills like young sheep?
- ⁷ Tremble, O earth, at the presence of the Lord, * at the presence of the God of Jacob,
- ⁸ Who turned the hard rock into a pool of water * and flint-stone into a flowing spring.

Psalm 115 Non nobis, Domine

- ¹ Not to us, O Lord, not to us, but to your Name give glory; * because of your love and because of your faithfulness.
- ¹¹ You who admire the Lord, trust in the Lord; * he is their help and their shield.
- ¹² The Lord has been mindful of us, and he will bless us; * he will bless the house of Israel; he will bless the house of Aaron;
- ¹³ He will bless those who admire the Lord, * both small and great together.
- ¹⁴ May the Lord increase you more and more, * you and your children after you.

- ¹³ Precious in the sight of the Lord * is the death of his servants.

I am your servant and the child of your handmaid; you have freed me from my bonds.

- ¹⁵ I will offer you the sacrifice of thanksgiving * and call upon the Name of the Lord.
- ¹⁶ I will fulfill my vows to the Lord * in the presence of all his people,

- ¹⁶ How deep I find your thoughts, O God! * how great is the sum of them!
- ¹⁷ If I were to count them, they would be more in number than the sand; * to count them all, my life span would need to be like yours.
- ²² Search me out, O God, and know my heart; * try me and know my restless thoughts.
- ²³ Look well whether there be any wickedness in me * and lead me in the way that is everlasting.

Psalm 140 Eripe me, Domine

- ¹ Deliver me, O Lord, from evildoers; * protect me from the violent,
- ⁶ I have said to the Lord, "You are my God; * listen, O Lord, to my supplication.

- 8 Do not grant the desires of the wicked, O Lord, * Nor let their evil plans prosper.
- ¹⁰ Let hot burning coals fall upon them." *
- ¹² I know that the Lord will maintain the cause of the poor * and render justice to the needy.
- ¹³ Surely, the righteous will give thanks to your Name, * and the upright shall continue in your sight.

Psalm 141 Domine, clamavi

- ¹ O Lord, I call to you; come to me quickly; * hear my voice when I cry to you.
- ² Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as incense, * the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.
- ³ Set a watch before my mouth, O Lord, and guard the door of my lips; * let not my heart incline to any evil thing.
- ⁵ Let the righteous smite me in friendly rebuke. *
- 8 My eyes are turned to you, Lord God; * in you I take refuge.

Psalm 142 Voce mea ad Dominum

- ¹ I cry to the Lord with my voice; * to the Lord I make loud supplication.
- ² I pour out my complaint before him * and tell him all my trouble.
- ³ When my spirit languishes within me, you know my path. *
- ⁴ I look to my right hand and find no one who knows me; * I have no place to flee to, and no one cares for me.
- ⁵ I cry out to you, O Lord; *
- I say, "You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living."
- ⁶ Listen to my cry for help, for I have been brought very low. *
- ⁷ Bring me out of prison, that I may give thanks to your Name. *

Psalm 143 Domine, exaudi

- ¹ Lord, hear my prayer, and in your faithfulness heed my supplications; * answer me in your righteousness.
- ² Enter not into judgment with your servant, * for in your sight shall no one living be justified.
- ⁵ I remember the time past; I muse upon all your deeds; * I consider the works of your hands.
- ⁶ I spread out my hands to you; * my soul gasps to you like a thirsty land.
- ⁸ Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning, for I put my trust in you; * show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you.
- ¹⁰ Teach me to do what pleases you, for you are my God; * let your good Spirit lead me on level ground.

Psalm 144 Benedictus Dominus

- ¹ Blessed be the Lord my rock! *
- ² My help and my fortress, my stronghold and my deliverer, * my shield in whom I trust.
- ³ O Lord, what are we that you should care for us? * mere mortals that you should think of us?
- ⁴ We are like a puff of wind; * our days are like a passing shadow.
- ⁹ O God, I will sing to you a new song; *I will play to you on a ten-stringed lyre.
- ¹⁴ May our barns be filled to overflowing with all manner of crops; * may the flocks in our pastures increase by thousands and tens of thousands; may our cattle be fat and sleek.
- ¹⁵ May there be no breaching of the walls, no going into exile, * no wailing in the public squares.
- ¹⁶ Happy are the people of whom this is so! * happy are the people whose God is the Lord!

Psalm 145 Exaltabo te, Deus

- ¹ I will exalt you, O God my King, * and bless your Name for ever and ever.
- ² Every day will I bless you * and praise your Name for ever and ever.
- ³ Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised; * there is no end to his greatness.
- ⁴ One generation shall praise your works to another * and shall declare your power.
- ⁵ I will ponder the glorious splendor of your majesty * and all your marvelous works.
- ⁶ They shall speak of the might of your wondrous acts, * and I will tell of your greatness.
- ⁷ They shall publish the remembrance of your great goodness; * they shall sing of your righteous deeds.
- ⁸ The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, * slow to anger and of great kindness.
- ⁹ The Lord is loving to everyone * and his compassion is over all his works.
- ¹⁰ All your works praise you, O Lord, * and your faithful servants bless you.
- ¹¹ They make known the glory of your kingdom * and speak of your power;
- ¹² That the peoples may know of your power * and the glorious splendor of your kingdom.
- ¹³ Your kingdom is an everlasting kingdom; * your dominion endures throughout all ages.
- ¹⁴ The Lord is faithful in all his words * and merciful in all his deeds.

- ¹⁵ The Lord upholds all those who fall; * he lifts up those who are bowed down.
- ¹⁶ The eyes of all wait upon you, O Lord, * and you give them their food in due season.
- ¹⁷ You open wide your hand * and satisfy the needs of every living creature.
- ¹⁸ The Lord is righteous in all his ways * and loving in all his works.
- ¹⁹ The Lord is near to those who call upon him, * to all who call upon him faithfully.
- ²⁰ He fulfills the desire of those who adore him; * he hears their cry and helps them.
- ²¹ The Lord preserves all those who love him, *
- ²² My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord; * let all flesh bless his holy Name for ever and ever.

Psalm 146 Lauda, anima mea

- ¹ Hallelujah! Praise the Lord, O my soul! * I will praise the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God while I have my being.
- ⁴ Happy are they who have the God of Jacob for their help! * whose hope is in the Lord their God;
- ⁵ Who made heaven and earth, the seas, and all that is in them; * who keeps his promise for ever;
- ⁶ Who gives justice to those who are oppressed, * and food to those who hunger.
- ⁷ The Lord sets the prisoners free; the Lord opens the eyes of the blind; * the Lord lifts up those who are bowed down;
- ⁸ The Lord loves the righteous; the Lord cares for the stranger; * he sustains the orphan and widow.
- ⁹ The Lord shall reign for ever, * your God, O Zion, throughout all generations. Hallelujah!

Psalm 147 Laudate Dominum

- ¹ Hallelujah! How good it is to sing praises to our God! * how pleasant it is to honor him with praise!
- ² The Lord rebuilds Jerusalem; * he gathers the exiles of Israel.
- ³ He heals the brokenhearted * and binds up their wounds.
- ⁴ He counts the number of the stars * and calls them all by their names.
- ⁵ Great is our Lord and mighty in power; * there is no limit to his wisdom.
- ⁶ The Lord lifts up the lowly. *
- ⁷ Sing to the Lord with thanksgiving; * make music to our God upon the harp.

- 8 He covers the heavens with clouds * and prepares rain for the earth;
- ⁹ He makes grass to grow upon the mountains * and green plants to serve humankind.
- ¹⁰ He provides food for flocks and herds * and for the young ravens when they cry.
- ¹¹ He is not impressed by the might of a horse; * he has no pleasure in the strength of a man;
- ¹² But the Lord has pleasure in those who adore him, * in those who await his gracious favor.
- ¹³ Worship the Lord, O Jerusalem; * praise your God, O Zion;
- ¹⁴ For he has strengthened the bars of your gates; * he has blessed your children within you.
- ¹⁵ He has established peace on your borders; * he satisfies you with the finest wheat.
- ¹⁶ He sends out his command to the earth, * and his word runs very swiftly.
- ¹⁷ He gives snow like wool; * he scatters hoarfrost like ashes.
- ¹⁸ He scatters his hail like bread crumbs; * who can stand against his cold?
- ¹⁹ He sends forth his word and melts them; * he blows with his wind, and the waters flow. Hallelujah!

Psalm 148 Laudate Dominum

- ¹ Hallelujah! Praise the Lord from the heavens; * praise him in the heights.
- ² Praise him, all you angels of his; * praise him, all his host.
- ³ Praise him, sun and moon; * praise him, all you shining stars.
- ⁴ Praise him, heaven of heavens, * and you waters above the heavens.
- ⁵ Let them praise the Name of the Lord; * for he commanded, and they were created.
- ⁶ He made them stand fast for ever and ever; * he gave them a law which shall not pass away.
- ⁷ Praise the Lord from the earth, * you sea-monsters and all deeps;
- 8 Fire and hail, snow and fog, * tempestuous wind, doing his will;
- ⁹ Mountains and all hills, * fruit trees and all cedars;
- ¹⁰ Wild beasts and all cattle, * creeping things and winged birds;

- ¹¹ Kings of the earth and all peoples, * princes and all rulers of the world;
- ¹² Young men and maidens, * old and young together.
- ¹³ Let them praise the Name of the Lord, * for his Name only is exalted, his splendor is over earth and heaven.
- ¹⁴ He has raised up strength for his people and praise for all his loyal servants, * the children of Israel, a people who are near him. Hallelujah!

Psalm 149 Cantate Domino

- ¹ Hallelujah! Sing to the Lord a new song; * sing his praise in the congregation of the faithful.
- ² Let Israel rejoice in his Maker; * let the children of Zion be joyful in their King.
- ³ Let them praise his Name in the dance; * let them sing praise to him with timbrel and harp.
- ⁴ For the Lord takes pleasure in his people * and adorns the poor with victory.
- ⁵ Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; * let them be joyful on their beds.
- ⁶ Let the praises of God be in their throat *
- ⁹ this is glory for all his faithful people. Hallelujah!

Psalm 150 Laudate Dominum

- ¹ Hallelujah! Praise God in his holy temple; * praise him in the firmament of his power.
- ² Praise him for his mighty acts; * praise him for his excellent greatness.
- ³ Praise him with the blast of the ram's-horn; * praise him with lyre and harp.
- ⁴ Praise him with timbrel and dance; * praise him with strings and pipe.
- ⁵ Praise him with resounding cymbals; * praise him with loud-clanging cymbals.
- ⁶ Let everything that has breath * praise the Lord. Hallelujah!
